#### 1. CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER

# 3. CONSENT AGENDA

#### MINUTES FOR JANUARY 9, 2020

Esther Koontz moved to approve the minutes as presented. Patrick Webb seconded, motion passed.

#### 4. CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

John Marta moved to approve payment of all bills as presented. Seconded by Sheila Maki, motion passed.

#### 5. PUBLIC COMMENT

Mike Morgan, Foreman of the Public Works Shop Building Project introduced himself to the Board.

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#### 6. OLD BUSINESS

#### BUILDING CODE UPGRADE UPDATE-MAYOR WILKENING

Mayor Wilkening told the Board that he sent all of the information gathered for the Building Code Update to Attorney Nerlin. Attorney Nerlin will create an Ordinance for this upgrade with the possible first reading in March.

ORDINANCE 2020-01 POSSIBLE FIRST READING - MOBILE HOME REGULATONS Attorney Nerlin stated that this is just the possible first reading. For the final reading and adoption in March there will be a clean copy handed out to the Board. Sheila Maki moved to approve the first reading of Ordinance of 2020-01, an Ordinance of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Hotchkiss, Colorado, Amending certain sections of Chapter 10, Article 7 of the Town Code. Seconded by Mary Hockenbery, motion passed.

## 7. PUBLIC HEARINGS

# BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT REQUEST-415 E LORAH LANE-SCOTT AND LEAH KEATING

Mayor Wilkening explained the rules of a Public Hearing. The Planning Commission discussed this item at length and recommended approval to the Board.

Stephan Cragg of Cragg Surveying completed the survey and explained to the Board the adjustments needed. The School will have an easement to be able to access their irrigation water and the Town will still have a right of way after the adjustments are completed. When the Keatings bought the property they did not realize that their irrigation pump was on school property. There was also a portion of the property that was still owned by Ron Heatherington that has since been quit claimed to the Keatings. The School Board has agreed to this adjustment to clean up the boundaries for both properties.

The Hearing was opened for Public Comment at 7:09 p.m. Hearing none, the Public Comment was closed at 7:09 p.m.

Esther Koontz moved to approve the Boundary Adjustments for the property located at 415 Lorah Lane. Sheila Maki seconded, motion passed.

Engineer Joanne Fagan told the Board that the Water Tank Project is nearing completion. Pitt Construction is working on another project at the moment but will be finishing up when the frost is out of the ground. Once Pitt finishes, Doughty can disinfect the tank and it can be filled.

Ford Construction is here to request that the Town approve them working through the weekend to get the steel erected for the new Public Works Shop Building. The only inspection that will be needed is on the bolts once it is done.

Mary Hockenbery moved to approve Ford Construction working weekends to get the steel erected for the new Public Works Shop Building. Seconded by John Marta, motion passed. Esther Koontz had concerns about the start time on the weekends and asked that they let the neighbors know when they will be starting.

Engineer Joanne Fagan said that pay applications from Ford Construction have some things that need to be worked through. She asked the Board to approve Staff negotiating them and allowing payment once negotiated.

Esther Koontz moved to approve Town Staff negotiating payment applications and payment to Ford Construction once it is all worked out. Seconded by Sheila Maki, motion passed.

#### TOWN MARSHAL'S REPORT
